#### NON-CONSENT RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolution 12: Council on Peer Review and Quality Assurance \$: None

**Peer Review and Quality Assurance Term Limits:** The Reference Committee heard testimony both for and against term limits on Peer Review. The decision to have new members serve on the Council on Peer Review and Quality Assurance is best left to the components. It is the recommendation of the Committee to adopt Resolution 12.

**12. Resolved**, that the sixth unlettered Subparagraph of Paragraph A of Section 20 of Chapter VIII of the NYSDA Bylaws be amended to read as follows: (<u>underlined</u> material is new: <del>struck through</del> material is deleted):

The Council on Peer Review and Quality Assurance shall be composed of one (1) member from each component society whose terms of office shall be staggered in such a manner that three (3) members will complete their terms each year except every fourth year when four (4) members shall complete their terms, and who shall serve as the chair of the Committee on Peer Review and Quality Assurance for the component society; and one (1) new dentist member of the Association. In addition, the President shall appoint a lay observer for a concurrent term of office, who is not a dentist or directly involved with the dental profession, to participate in the deliberations of the Council making available the opinions and concerns of the public sector. Notwithstanding any other provisions of the Bylaws, there shall be no limits to the number of terms for any component society members of the Council on Peer Review and Quality Assurance.

2. Resolution 17: Board of Trustees \$ -43,000

Amendment of NYSDA Bylaws House of Delegates Composition: The Reference Committee heard considerable testimony most of which was against the resolution. The Reference Committee believes that reducing the size of the House of Delegates would inhibit the participation of members, particularly younger members, which may inadvertently decrease overall membership. We recommend that alternative cost-saving measures be investigated. It is the recommendation of the Committee not to adopt Resolution 17.

**17. Resolved**, that Chapter III, Section 10 of the Bylaws of the New York State Dental Association be amended as follows (new language <u>underscored</u>; deletions <u>stricken through</u>):

CHAPTER III. HOUSE OF DELEGATES

Section 10. Composition:

A. Voting Members. The House of Delegates shall consist of ene hundred two (102) sixty nine (69) voting members of the Association. It shall be composed of the officially certified delegates of the component societies in accordance with Chapter II, Section 100 of these Bylaws, and two (2) student members of the Association who are the officially certified delegates from District 2 of the American Student Dental Association.

**Resolved**, that this will take effect at the 2027 House of Delegates Meeting.
