Report of the New York State Dental Foundation

The Board of Trustees of the New York State Dental Foundation (Foundation) met on July 25, 2023, October 27, 2023 and February 8, 2024. Minutes of these meetings are on file in the Foundation office.

Treasurer's Report: A full breakdown of the Foundation's financials can be found in the consolidated NYSDA audit attached to the NYSDA Board of Trustees report to the House of Delegates.

Nominations: The Board unanimously adopted the following candidate to the 2024 Foundation Board of Trustees for a one-year term of office, commencing January 1, 2024: Dr. Rory Ogden.

Committee Updates

 Annual Event Task Force – The Foundation's Annual Brunch will take place during the NYSDA Annual Session on Saturday, June 1, 2024. The event will celebrate the early successes of the Foundation's new Salute Vets with a Smile program. Major sponsors include MLMIC and Colgate Palmolive and the Foundation projects a total of more than \$30,000 will be generated from the event.

Once again in the spirit of mentorship and inclusivity, the Task Force will promote sponsorship of ASDA students to attend the Brunch, with an added opportunity to sit with one's sponsored student at the event.

 Charitable Grants Committee – Funds given to the Foundation through the Estate of Evangeline Lata, a total of \$25,000, were distributed to dental care programs for the underserved at St. Barnabas Hospital, Family Health Centers at NYU Langone, and Jamaica Hospital.

The Committee has recommended supporting New York State "Give Kids a Smile" events with \$500 sponsorships moving forward.

 Smiles to Go! donations of oral health kits and educational materials in English and Spanish were approved for (4) applicants, including Northern Adirondack Elementary School, Poughkeepsie Center PROS, Harmony Healthcare Long Island, and PS 295 in Brooklyn.

• **CE Advisory Task Force** – Overall net revenue from course income in 2023 was up 92% from the year prior due to the course that the Foundation offered on prescribing opioids to satisfy the new DEA mandate in June, given by Dr. Marc Gottlieb. Online course hosting fees were up 5% from the year prior for the same reason.

A new Infection Control course given by Dr. Alyssa Tzetzo has been launched; it is a 3-credit course that satisfies the NYS mandate. A new digital delivery method is available in place of the previous DVD format which would be sent to a dental office looking to take the course as a staff. Additionally, a new 12-hour sedation course launched earlier this year as a three-part course delivered with digital links to reduce costs. Plans are in the works to offer a course on Aerosol Sterilization of the Dental Office. All available courses can be accessed through the Foundation's website and net revenue generated from courses supports our mission.

The Trustees resolved to change the group's name to the CE Advisory Task Force, thereby removing the CERP oversight function which is now being handled by NYSDA.

Development – In response to action taken by the NYSDA Board of Trustees at their September 22, 2023 Board meeting, the suggested donation to the Foundation appearing on the NYSDA dues statement was increased to \$95, which will provide for a projected annual increase in revenue of \$30,000 in 2024. Immediately following the decision, the Foundation launched a *Check the Box* campaign to encourage elective donations to the Foundation through dues renewal.

The Foundation celebrated a highly successful first-ever #GivingToothday peer-to-peer campaign that resulted in \$13,000 in donations around Giving Tuesday. The Development Committee continues to seek a matching sponsor to garner even more support for the 2024 campaign.

The Foundation rolled out a planned giving program called the *Gleason Legacy Circle* to recognize and honor individuals who have remembered our organization in their estate plans. A free webinar was offered to NYSDA members in March to give an overview of the program, along with our partners at KeyBank who delivered timely info about the tax benefits of charitable planning in 2024.

Program Updates

The Foundation has transitioned management of the continuing education registry to NYSDA, enabling the organization to focus on growing revenue and programs to serve New York's most vulnerable populations.

Our investment in the next generation of dental professionals continues through the *Champions for Change* program. A group of students from Columbia, NYU and Touro was transported to Ithaca College on June 10, 2023, for the Special Olympics Summer Games, where they conducted oral health screenings for more than 110 athletes at a Special Smiles booth. The Foundation will participate again in 2024 by reimbursing students up to \$200 each for transportation to Ithaca to be a part of the Special Smiles screening program at the 2024 State Games on June 15.

On July 25, 2024, the Foundation Board of Trustees approved the adoption of a new pilot program called *My Healthy Smile NY*, aimed at addressing oral health disparities in New York State by deploying Community Dental Health Coordinators in six different regions. The Foundation received a pledge of \$40,000 from the Henry Schein Cares Foundation to support the program over the next four years. Additional grant proposals have been submitted to the Delta Dental Community Care Foundation and the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation.

During National Recovery Month in September, the Foundation solicited contributions for the *Dr. Thomas H. Sullivan Fund* to have funds at the ready to support dentists with the cost of inpatient substance abuse treatment, raising \$5,000 to replenish funds expended the prior year.

In partnership with NYSDA's Dental Demonstration Project team, the Foundation supported the October 21st Capital Region Community Dental Event at Hudson Valley Community College with both funding and logistical coordination. More than 100 attended for screenings and emergent care.

On January 1, 2024, the Foundation formally launched the *Salute Vets with a Smile* program, which was widely covered by news outlets throughout the state, prompting dozens of Vets to reach out for help. By April, a total of 75 Veterans were connected to free dental care provided by volunteer dentists, whose numbers nearly tripled within a few short months.
